**Text: 1Timothy 1:12-17**

### **I. OUT OF SERVICE**

If anyone should have been out of service it would have been Paul. However, God takes a disastrous past and uses it for his glory.

### **II. SALVATION TO SINNERS**

(v.15) “The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost.”

Many religious leaders of the day thought **sinners had lost their chance with God**. They thought they were so far outside of the realm of what was good and right that there was **no way** that they could be welcomed by God.

Paul is saying that he is worse than all of the sinners...that no one has ever been more separated from God than he has.

God’s love for the sinner **is unstoppable** no matter how disastrous your past may have be.
