Sermon: "Jesus: Hung On the Cross for Our Healing"

Text: Isaiah 53:1-6 (page 613 in pew Bible)

I. The message of The Child to be born falls on deaf ears, vs 1

"Who has believed what he has heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?"

II. The majesty of the Child to be born not seen by blind eyes, vs. 2-4

"For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not....Yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted."

III. The mission of the Child to be born; our healing through His dying, vs. 5-6

- A. His suffering and death a substitution.
 - His death for our sins

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities..."

- B. His suffering and death a propitiation.
 - His death for God's justice

"The LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all."

- C. His suffering and death a restoration.
 - His death for our salvation

"Upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed."

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
