

Sermon: “Jesus: Hung On the Cross for Our Healing”
Text: Isaiah 53:1-6 (page 613 in pew Bible)

I. The *message* of The Child to be born falls on deaf ears, vs 1

“Who has believed what he has heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?”

II. The *majesty* of the Child to be born not seen by blind eyes, vs. 2-4

“For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not....Yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.”

III. The *mission* of the Child to be born; our healing through His dying, vs. 5-6

A. His suffering and death a substitution.

- **His death for our sins**

“All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities...”

B. His suffering and death a propitiation.

- **His death for God’s justice**

“The LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.”

C. His suffering and death a restoration.

- **His death for our salvation**

“Upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.”

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
